**GENERAL REGULATIONS**  
**PLEASE READ CAREFULLY**

Clause 1 - The building will be open during the day and evening previous to opening day of the exhibition to **T0 EXHIBITORS AND COMMITTEE WORKERS ONLY** - for the reception and arrangement of exhibits. Judging commences at 9:00 p.m. on evening prior to opening day and continues through opening day until completed.

Clause 2 - Premium will be awarded to competitors for articles of their own growth, production or ownership in the case of livestock.

Clause 3 - All articles exhibited except livestock must be growth or manufacture of the present year.

Clause 4 - Entry fee will be 15% of regular prize money, except where otherwise stated.

Clause 5 - The age, breed and description of all animals must be given, and registry name and number in case of all purebred stock.

Clause 6 - Entry numbers and tags can be picked up at the office at the time that the exhibits are brought to the show.

Clause 7 - All entries must have the name of the article and the exhibitor's entry number. Also the name of the exhibitor, which is to be covered up until judging, is complete.

Clause 8 - Exhibitors will in every case give personal attention to whatever they exhibit and in the case of livestock, bear all risks and expense in connection therewith.

Clause 9 - No person shall act as a judge in any class in which that person is an exhibitor.

Clause 10 - The Exhibition will be opened to the public at 9:00 a.m. on the first day of the exhibition. All exhibitors and caretakers must have tickets before entering the grounds.

Clause 11 - No person shall be allowed to enter for exhibition more than one specimen in one section of a class, except in the animal classes. Animals may be shown in more than one class or section under the following conditions:

- (1) Foals of this year which may compete with their dam also separately.
- (2) Animals competing for special prizes and as a herd.
- (3) Cows with progeny by side may compete separately.

Clause 12 - If any person practices any deception with respect to anything he or she exhibits, he or she shall forfeit all prizes that may have been awarded to them.

Clause 13 - All fancy work, cooking, arts and crafts, fruit and vegetables must be in the building and in charge of the committees by 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday before the exhibition. Livestock and flowers, if already entered will be received up to 8:30 a.m. on the first day of the exhibition.

Clause 14 - The judges shall not award a premium to any animals or article of an inferior quality which might not be otherwise entitled to it for want of competition.

Clause 15 - Premiums to be picked up at the office after 6:00 p.m. on Saturday.

Clause 16 - No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties. Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit their right to any premiums to which they might otherwise be entitled.

Clause 17 - All animals will be considered pure bred that are duly registered in any herd, stud or stock book. Registration papers must accompany exhibit into ring.

Clause 18 - In the case of any section in any class where the exhibits exceed five and have evidence of merit the judge is authorized to issue subsequent prizes in accordance with the number of entries. Such prizes not to exceed a third prize in value. One prize awarded to each three entries over and above three entries. This does not pertain to cattle and horses.

Clause 19- No exhibitor shall be allowed to change an entry after the exhibit has been place on the fairgrounds without consulting the office.

Clause 20 - All exhibits must remain in their place until 8:00 p.m. on the last day of the exhibition and may only be removed under the supervision of a committee member. Also at 8:00 p.m. on the last day, display areas will be closed to the general public and only committee members and exhibitors wishing to remove exhibits will be allowed there.

Clause 21- LIVESTOCK not shown four days of the exhibition will be liable to cancellation of prize awarded.

Clause 22 - No pets are allowed on the Exhibition grounds during Exhibition Week except pets of exhibitors, which must be confined to the trailer park or on a leash at all times.

Clause 23 - Livestock are not to be ridden at any time on the Exhibition grounds unless entered as Light Horse Entries. Animals not taking part in Pulling Contests are to be in their stalls after 12:00 Midnight.
